### THE ECONOMISTS' CORNER

The long-awaited Budget 2023 was announced last Tuesday. It aims to prepare for unforeseen risks and challenges that were caused by Brexit, COVID and Russia-Ukraine War. To ease the pressure of the rising cost of living, the Government announced a €4.1 billion package and €6.9 billion for core budget measures. The energy credit of €600 will be paid to all households in three instalments. Businesses will also be supported in paying their energy bills, up to €10,000 per month. To improve housing affordability, the Government extends the Help-to-Buy until the end of 2024 and also introduces a Vacant Homes Tax to maximise the existing housing stock to meet demand. The Budget attempts to build automatic stabilisers to cushion the shocks, it will ensure that we have abundant reserves that can keep the Irish economy in good shape.
