Thanos of Twitter

On the 27th of October Elon Musk sealed his \$44bn deal to buy the social media platform, Twitter. Musk has taken the company private and becomes the CEO, which means he does not need to answer to shareholders or make decisions that are constrained by the board of directors. Musk said he was buying Twitter to protect free speech and promised a more relaxed approach to content moderation. Right after the acquisition, Twitter laid off around 50% of its global workforce and top executives – amounting to an estimated 3,700 people.

Musk's fast, aggressive and counter-cultural approach has been criticised. The modern manager tends to have McGregor's Theory Y attitude, a low-ego, compassionate boss who gives people motivation and autonomy. A Harvard Business School working paper published in 2020 indicated that bosses who use more structured processes and make decisions slowly, tend to lead bigger and faster-growing firms.
