






🧆 STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

We are delighted to have three teams qualify for the national finals after their success in Gonzaga last week. We had four teams competing and there were a total of 61 teams taking part at Gonzaga. It was an exciting competition and towards the end five teams were in a tie-break as they had got perfect scores in all eight rounds of questions. In the end we came third and fifth place, plus we had a team that wasn't placed but who did well enough to make it through to the finals.

The annual IMTA Maths Olympiad is a team maths competition for Leaving Certificate students that has been running since 1991. Out of 350 teams nationwide 19 teams made the final of Team Maths (3 from The Institute of Education) which takes place on Saturday 20th April in Maynooth University.
