


Congratulations to 5th years Kent (Liyuan) Liu, Yu Fei Shao and Tianci Yan who not only got first, second and third place in the AMC 12 exam in The Institute of Education but in all of Ireland! Kent (Liyuan) Liu received first place, Yu Fei Shao second place and Tianci Yan third place. Kent got such a high mark (120/150) in the AMC 12 exam that he got a distinction, meaning that of all the students who took part in this contest worldwide, he is in the top 5 percent. Oliver Murphy is also holding a special award above - which The Institute of Education received because the total of the top three students was over 300.

Their results in the AMC 12 also meant that they qualified for the American Invitational Maths Exam (AIME) 2025 this month. We do not yet have the results for AIME 2025 but look forward to hearing how they got on. Well done to our students on their amazing results and a huge thank you to Oliver Murphy for organising the competition.

To check if your NUI or TCD exemption has been recorded by the CAO, go to the Qualifications and Assessments section of your CAO application.

A record of an exemption granted by NUI appears as:

NUI Irish Language exemption recorded.

NUI Third Language exemption recorded.

A record of an exemption/waiver granted by TCD appears as:

Trinity College language exemption recorded.

CAO do not record exemptions that have been granted by University of Limerick or Mary Immaculate College. These exemptions will not appear on your CAO application.
